Rep. Rita joins local leaders as Park District takes over Tinley Park Mental Health Center site

State Rep. Bob Rita, D-Blue Island, on Monday joined with fellow legislators, local officials, and environmental experts to mark the official transfer of ownership of the former Tinley Park Mental Health Center site. Rita helped lead legislation through the Illinois General Assembly that sold the former state property to the Park District of Tinley Park for \$1.

Rita also helped ensure \$15 million was included in the state budget to clean up the property and prepare it for the Park District to take over.

Rita said he was proud of the cooperative spirit all involved in the land exchange showed over the past year to get to this point.

"For too many years, this site was an eyesore and frustration for the residents of Tinley Park. But with the leadership and teamwork of all of us working together, now it will become a crown jewel for recreation in the area," Rita said. "I appreciate the hard work that has been done to date and am proud to have helped ensure the Park District is in charge of the site's future. Brighter and better days are ahead for this land, this community, and the region."



Palos 118 Board Approves Resolution for Free Full Day Kindergarten

At a recent meeting, the Palos 118 Board of Education voted to approve a conditional resolution for free full day kindergarten to start in fall 2024 should voters approve a referendum that will appear on the March 19, 2024, ballot.

Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Anthony Scarsella told board members at the regular board meeting that the State of Illinois has mandated that all Illinois public school districts must provide free full day kindergarten starting in the 2027-2028 school year but the successful passage of the district's referendum in March would provide funding to start the program 3 years ahead of the state mandated deadline.

Scarsella said that the resolution is the first formal step to implementing the full day program if voters approve the referendum. The District currently offers a tuitionbased full-day program that requires families to pay \$3,250 per student for a full day of instruction.

On the March 19 ballot, Palos 118 is asking voters to approve a referendum that would allow the school district to shift approximately \$4.35 million in future property taxes from its debt service fund to its operating fund to address financial challenges stemming from unfunded mandates from the state and federal government. From that, the District plans to utilize \$2 million to eliminate growing budget deficits and avoid cuts to programs and services, another \$2 million that will fund capital improvements to the district's aging school buildings, with the remaining \$350,000 that will be used to pay for the State's free full-day kindergarten mandate.

Polaris Storm Sewer Improvement Project in Oak Lawn

The Village of Oak Lawn is working with the MWRD to address persistent flooding by creating additional stormwater storage and improving storm sewers.

Oak Lawn has had severe urban flooding that has impacted hundreds of residents, filling homes and yards with stormwater. To address this flooding, the Village and Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) have approved a flood control project near Polaris Intermediate (PIE) School.

The project will include a stormwater storage

sport fields at PIE, the layout of which has been mutually agreed upon after public presentations, renderings, and a recorded stormwater easement. The fields will serve as temporary storage for overflow stormwater: a new storm sewer system will backflow into the fields once the sewer pipes fill up and slowly release back into the storm sewer system as the downstream system allows. The project will have no downstream impacts and will be permitted through MWRD. The new underdrain system will greatly increase

the field's ability to drain water and return to use.

The project will include new baseball fields, a football field, retaining walls, stairways and ramps for maintenance vehicle access. Additionally, roads will be resurfaced where the storm sewer is installed along both 105th St. and Kilpatrick Avenue.

The Village is currently negotiating an intergovernmental agreement with MWRD to share construction costs. Final project design is ongoing and design is expected to be completed in August 2024. Construction is expected to begin in Fall 2024.




