New Cook County Grants for Arts Organizations

The Cook County Bureau of Economic Development launched a new grant program to assist arts and culture organizations in building resiliency in the post-pandemic economy.

The Nonprofit Relief Grant Program is a component of Cook County Arts, a \$5 million pilot arts initiative funded by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). Cook County Arts focuses on suburban communities as many artists and organizations there are ineligible for major funding opportunities available through the City of Chicago. The Cook County Bureau of Economic Development is spearheading the initiative, which will include relief grants, creative place making investments and new research on the suburban arts sector.

Illinois households could lose affordable internet access

Barring Congressional action to fund the Affordable Connectivity Program, nearly 23 million rural, suburban, and urban households risk losing affordable high-speed internet.

FCC Chairwoman Jessica Rosenworcel today wrote to Congressional appropriators to formally inform them that, in one week, the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) will no longer accept new enrollments. To make clear the real-world impacts if Congress does not renew funding for this critical broadband affordability program, the Chairwoman shared enrollment data for every state, territory and Congressional district which show that more than 694,922 households in Illinois could be at risk of losing affordable internet access.

"The Affordable Connectivity Program is connecting millions and millions of households across the country. The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law created this program, our largest-ever effort to make broadband affordable nationwide, but we now are on the brink of letting that success slip away," said FCC Chairwoman Jessica Rosenworcel. "Disconnecting millions of families from their jobs, schools, markets, and information is not the solution. We have come too far with the ACP to turn back."

The ACP is the largest, and most successful, broadband affordability program in our nation's history. Nearly 23 million households across rural, suburban, and urban America rely on the ACP to pay for the high-speed internet service they need for school, work, health care, and more. The ACP supports eligible low-income households struggling to afford monthly broadband service.

In accordance with preestablished wind down procedures, the ACP will stop accepting new enrollments on February 8, 2024, and an outreach effort is already underway to tell ACP households about the potential loss of the benefit. Last week, broadband providers were required to send an initial notice to all their ACP subscribers to preview the possible end of the ACP and the impact on the house-

holds' broadband bills once the ACP benefit is no longer available. Following the FCC announcing the official final month of ACP funding, ACP providers must send at least two more notices to households informing them that the ACP is ending, how and when the end of the ACP will impact their bill, and that they may opt-out of continuing service after the end of the ACP or change their service.

As announced in January, ACP funding is currently expected to last through April with only partial support available in May 2024. Without more funding, nearly 23 million households across the country are at risk of losing internet access. A bipartisan group of Senators and Representatives have introduced the Affordable Connectivity Program Extension Act, which, if adopted, would provide an additional \$7 billion for the

Ladder Up's Tax-a-Thon: empowering low-income communities with free Tax Return filings

Chicago-based nonprofit, Ladder Up, is again set to return hard-earned money to low-income residents in the city and suburbs in the form of free tax return filings, is available now.

The organization's annual Tax-a-Thon event took place at Olive-Harvey College, 10001 S. Woodlawn Ave., Chicago, Illinois. This event brings dozens of tax expert volunteers to provide free, high-quality tax filing services to individuals earning up to \$32,000 a year and families earning up to \$64,000 a year.

Executive Director Phyllis Cavallone-Jurek said Tax-a-Thon, as well as the several Tax Assistance Program (TAP) sites in operation now through April, serve a critical purpose.

"This event kicks off our tax season throughout all our 13 tax sites and brings about awareness of our services. Many of those we serve reside in underserved communities where trustworthy financial services are scarce," Cavallone-Jurek said.

The Ladder Up website provides a full list of documentation to bring to a tax filing session. Tax-a-Thon and the TAP sites are walk-in only, and sites close once capacity is reached. Clients will receive gift bags and could win raffle prizes at the Tax-a-Thon event. Ladder Up also offers a digital tax preparation service, called eTAP, to those who prefer digital support. Palos Heights Police Department: Things to look for during Tax Season

As we enter tax season, the Palos Heights Police would like to make our citizens aware of some common scams that we encounter.

These scams are mostly related to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) telephone scams and tax related identity theft. The individuals associated with these scams are professional criminals and are not afraid to use aggressive tactics to intimidate their targets into believing that they owe money and that if payment is not made immediately, anything from being fined up to arrest will result.

Another thing to be on the look-out for are "phishing" scams in which you receive a notification from someone claiming to be from the IRS or other government office. In these incidents, the intent is to get the victim to provide vital personal information, which can then be used to steal that individual's identity. Identity theft can result in many outcomes,

including opening lines of credit in the victim's name, buying cars, then defaulting on those loans in the victim's name and even filing income tax returns in the victim's name to claim refunds.

The IRS does not initiate contact by means of e-mails, text messages or social media outlets. The IRS will also, NEVER request payment be made using credit cards, debit cards or pre-paid gift cards.

Things to look for: Scammers use fake names and badge numbers.

Scammers may be able to provide some identifying information about the target to gain credibility (partial social security number, birth date, etc).

Using recent technology, they may be able to "spoof" the telephone number showing up on your caller ID to identify as an IRS number.

If contact is via e-mail, click on the senders' e-mail address, this will show the actual sender information.

If contact is made, the scammer will threaten the victim with any number of possible penalties, such as fines, suspension of your driver's license or even arrest. They may then hang up and call back a short time later after the potential victim has become upset or anxious.

Anyone claiming to be from the IRS instructing you to pay a "fine or penalty" using a credit card, debit card, or any type of gift card.

NEVER provide anyone your banking information.

If you receive any communication that you are suspicious of you can call the IRS at 1-800-829-1040. DO NOT call any phone numbers provided by the suspected scammers.

If you believe that you have been targeted by one of these fraudulent entities, you can report it to your local police and the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration at 1-800-366-4484.

First installment property tax bills for tax year 2023 were mailed at the end of January, 2024, according to Robert Maloney. "Property taxes are paid in two installments. The first installment is fifty-five percent (55%) of a property's total tax bill for the previous year, and will be due on March 1, 2024," Robert Maloney said.

Taxpayers looking at this year's first installment bills should note that they do not reflect homeowner, senior citizen, or other exemptions, nor do reflect the impact of reassessments or successful assessment appeals from tax year 2023. Exemptions, reassessments, and successful appeals will instead impact second installment bills, as will the effect of changes in the tax levies of local governments. Second installment bills will likely be due in the summer or fall of 2024.

Details about Paying Taxes. Property owners who do not have mortgage companies paying their taxes can make tax payments in person, by mail, or online at the Cook County Treasurer's web site, www.cookcountytreasurer.com. Those wishing to pay in person can do so at the Cook County Treasurer's downtown office at 118 N. Clark Street and at any Chase Bank in the Chicago area. Chase branches most convenient to Palos Township residents.

If money for property taxes is paid into an escrow account with a taxpayer's mortgage company, the financial institution should receive the tax bill electronically, even if the taxpayer also receives a copy of the bill. Robert Maloney advises taxpayers with property tax escrows held by their mortgage companies not to pay property taxes on their own, as this may result in a double payment of taxes. But taxpayers with mortgage escrows should check the Cook County Treasurer's website to verify that their mortgage companies have paid the taxes.

I like what you said: we think "We were better than them." And yet some of us are, but others are not. We, all of us, need to continue to reach to a higher goal if we want to be proud of being Americans. Metra 2024 Fare Structure Change

Starting now, Metra has revamped its fare structure replacing the existing 10-zone distance-based structure with a four-zone structure.

Downtown stations will be assigned to Zone 1 and outlying stations will be assigned to Zone 2, Zone 3, or Zone 4 based on a combination of distance from downtown, service patterns and ridership characteristics on each line, which vary.

Metra made a variety of

changes to its fare structure, prices, and purchase channels effective Feb. 1. Here are the highlights, with details about all the changes below.

There is a new fare structure with a variety of new fare prices, products, and rules. Fares under the new structure are set at or below pre-pandemic levels.


