The general forms are conveniently available in the Township Lobby located at 10805 Roberts Road, Palos Hills, IL. Once the form is completed, you can simply drop in the "Completed" tray and go about your day as comparable properties will be located and the appeal will be filed online.

If the property was purchased in 2021, 2022, 2023 or 2024 then a copy of the Closing Disclosure needs to be attached. Please note that appeals

for condos and commercial properties are not completed here. The appeals can also be done online for commercial and condo associations. Condo appeals can only be done here if you are basing off a recent purchase.

Sheriff Dart warns public of phone and email scams

Cook County Sheriff Thomas J. Dart is alerting the public of a recent uptick in telephone and email phishing scams in which scammers identify themselves as a Sheriff's Office employee in an attempt to defraud victims.

Scammers are using the actual names and respective titles of Sheriff's Office employees to appear legitimate. Scammers may demand victims provide or verify personal and financial information or demand that they make payments via prepaid debit cards, gift cards, and third-party money apps.

The scammers may also send phishing email messages from addresses designed to appear as though they are legitimate Sheriff's Office email addresses. These messages may contain a link or attachment allowing the scammer to gain access to sensitive information when the victim attempts to use the link or attachment.

Scammers often use legal or police jargon to impersonate law enforcement officials and further intimidate the victims.

The public should be aware that these types of calls and emails are scams. Sheriff's Office employees do not ask for immediate compliance with orders or any form of payment via phone or email.

The Sheriff's Office offers the following tips to avoid becoming a victim of these scams:

If you believe a call is suspicious, immediately hang up.

Never give personal information such as Social Security numbers or bank account numbers over the phone or in response to any suspicious email.

If a scammer claims to be from a specific public agency, including the Cook County Sheriff's Office, contact that agency directly to determine whether there is a legitimate reason to contact you. Do not use any phone number or email address given to you by the scammer.

Do not click on any suspicious links or attachments. If you receive an unexpected email stating you need to confirm some personal and/or financial information, report the email as spam.

Individuals who believe they have been a victim of these scams are asked to call the Sheriff's Police Investigation Section at 708-865-4896 or the Sheriff's Police non-emergency number at 847-635-1188.





Two gorgeous books arrived on the shelves on our local library just in time for National Poetry Month: The Swan's Nest, a novel that begins in 1845, when Elizabeth Barrett, a young poet in possession of a significant fortune but confined to her room for four years with a chronic disease, received a letter from Robert Browning, whom she'd never met: "I love your verses with all my heart, Dear Miss Barrett, and I love you too," and Ten Bridges I've Burnt, a 21st- Century memoir in verse by Brontez Purnell, a poet, punk-rocker, dancer, actor, screenwriter, handsome, Queer, "troubled Negro Youth in his forties."

I chose Ten Bridges because we all know how Swan's Nest turns out and because the publisher has a blurb about certain "sexcapades." Now that I've read the book, I love Brontez Purnell. I want to be his grandmother (I just became one; it's divine) and feed him baked ham and apple crisp and tell him to be safe, that he's perfect, and must love himself more. Most readers will agree.

Purnell says the title is "a line describing how the person being interpreted has been misunderstood. And I think only the people that actually catch that, I think that's who included leading significant orchestras on several continents.

Having made his Lyric debut in 1986, Davis served as the company's music director and principal conductor from 2000 to 2021. He led nearly 700 performances of 62 operas by 22 different composers. "All of us at Lyric Opera





impending double emergence of Broods XIX and XIII this spring.

Despite a 13- or 17-year lifespan, periodical cicadas spend just weeks above ground, when males "sing" to woo potential partners. The emergence of two broods who haven't appeared together in more than two centuries promises to be extraordinary for those fortunate enough to witness (and hear!) it.

Cicadas are not harmful to humans, animal companions, household gardens, or crops; they actually benefit the environment in many ways. Females are little arborists, inadvertently pruning trees as they dig small slits in branches to lay their eggs. Their burrowing aerates the ground and improves water filtration. And when their short time above ground is over, their decomposing bodies enrich the soil as a natural fertilizer.

These remarkable beings are not culinary curiosities or threats to be eliminated. They are simply trying to complete their life cycle in peace. Let's recognize the significance of this moment for the cicadas themselves, and allow them to enjoy their long-awaited, albeit brief, visit undisturbed.
